SAFETY NOTES

Please make sure you read these instructions and retain for future use.

All products manufactured by Heritage Bathrooms are safe, providing they are installed and used correctly and also receive maintenance when needed.

Baths, including the connecting water and waste system need to be installed in accordance with and meet the requirements of the Water Supply Regulations 1999 (Water Fittings) and current by-laws. If you are in doubt about your ability to install this product correctly or safely, you should employ the services of a competent person who has experience fitting products of this nature.

This product must not be modified in any way otherwise this will invalidate the guarantee.

Consider the following whilst using power tools:

- Prior to drilling into walls, check there are no hidden electrical cables or wires and there are also no water pipes. These can potentially be found using an electrical or metal detector. You may also need to know some of the schematics of previous installations to determine the suitability and accommodation of the installation.
- Wear the correct PPE, especially ear, eye and hand protection when using power tools. Unplug any mains equipment after use.
- Keep electrical equipment away from sources of water.
- If a blow-lamp is used when plumbing, the flame must be kept well away from the product otherwise damage may occur.

Bath panels are very large; a lifting aid or second person at minimum will be required to manoeuvre safely.


Do not stand in the bath until the installation has been completed.


INSTALLATION

NOTE: The installation of this product greatly depends on the floor being level. If this is not the case, it must be corrected before installation.

- I. Measure the distance from under the lip of the bath to the floor using a tape measure. This must be done at both ends of the length of the bath (longest side). Record the measurements.
- 2. Measure the thickness of the bath panel and mark the thickness under the bath lip. This measurement is required for stage 3. You may wish to add on the thickness of the fixing used to hold the panel in position. The panel must sit flush or slightly indented to the bath lip.
- 3. Create a framework to attach the bath panel and plinth to. The framework shown in Fig.2 must be positioned so when the bath panel is seated, it fits correctly. 25mm timber is suitable for this purpose and can be fixed to the surrounding wall using suitable fixings for the wall type. Create the framework whilst also making sure access to the plumbing fixtures on the bath is available.

SIDE ON VIEW






- 4. Using the measurements obtained in stage I, connect the plinth to the bath panel using screws with a suitable length (not supplied). The combined height of both plinth and bath panel must not exceed the measurement between the underside of bath to floor as obtained in step-I, the layout of the connection can be seen in Fig.3.
- 5. Securing the bath panels and plinth using suitable screws/fixings. There are several methods to connecting the bath panel to the framework (as seen in Fig.4). Bear in mind that future access will be required to access the plumbing fixtures, so it may be an idea to use magnetic fixings when attaching the bath panel and plinth to the framework. Magnetic fixing kits, tape or even Velcro fixing kits can be obtained at most hardware stores. Alternatively, you can use screws and drill into the bath panel and through to the frame and cover with decorative screw covers. Please avoid screwing where there are joints as this will damage your product.

CARING FOR YOUR PRODUCT

Your product should be regularly cleaned with warm water, a mild pH-neutral liquid soap, and polished with a soft cloth. Any residues from soap, toiletries etc. should be rinsed off straight after use.

Household bleaches and cleaners contain harsh chemicals and may damage the surface finish. Avoid using abrasive cloths, scouring pads, scrub sponges, steel wool or anything similar.

Some surfaces such as nickel and pewter may be affected by the dye found in some cloths, so it is also important to avoid leaving cloths on surfaces.
